Students enrolled in the Keio International Program (KIP) are required to take a **minimum of seven (7) courses** from a combination of International Center Courses, undergraduate faculty courses, and Japanese language courses. For a single course at Keio, students normally meet once a week for 90 minutes, 15 times per semester. Please also note that restrictions or requirements may apply to some courses.

2 Undergraduate Faculty Courses (学部設置科目)
